



KWAN D TI TEMPLE

It is a romantic tale of adventure, shrouded in mystery and lacking in factual detail. Seven or eight junks left China in the early 1850's with crew members inspired by news of California's gold rush. They braved the Pacific to reach Jinshan, the Mountain of Gold, their name for San Francisco or California. Only two of the boats survived - one landing at Monterey and the other at Caspar Beach. The descendants of this voyage, the Celestials, worshipped the sun, moon and stars. The Kwan D Ti Temple in Mendocino was established by the Hee family in 1851 and restored in 1980. It is dedicated





MENDOCINO HOTEL

The historic Mendocino Hotel which is located off Highway 1 on Main Street faces Mendocino Bay and Big River. The crashing surf is but a short stroll through the meadows to the edge of Mendocino Headlands, where guests can view isolated coves & rocky outcroppings. The spacious waiting room is furnished with a



large fireplace and overstuffed antique sofas and chairs. In the lobby bar you can sit at semi-private tables for two to six people or drink at the stand up bar with its huge overhead stained glass valance. You can dine in the formal dining room or more casual sunlit garden room with its long bar.

The dining room serves in season wild salmon, fish n chips, choice cut steaks, poultry, and vegetarian entrees for lunch and dinner. For breakfast there is classic eggs benedict with in-house made holidaise sauce, eggs any style with country potatoes, bacon and sausage or French toast with fresh fruit and oatmeal. Favorite luncheon items are the wedge of lettuce smothered in heirloom tomatoes, blue cheese and bacon bits, a bowl of the hotel's original clam chowder and the bacon-avocado cheese burger with sweet potato fries. Try the Chocolate mousse or olallieberry dessert - puff pastry smothered with vanilla ice cream and hot olallieberries. The full bars serve all manner of drinks, premium wines, champagne, imported and craft beers.

There are 26 rooms upstairs in the Hotel (\$129 - \$309/2 weekdays \$365 weekends) and to the north the 1852 Heeser House and three architecturally recreated Garden Cottages with 25 rooms (from \$189) to\$249/2 for the luxury suite \$235 - \$299 weekends) equipped with fireplaces or woodstoves, balconies, and garden views. The hotel has conference facilities for 10 to 60 participants. There are special packages for government & military, senior citizens, group retreats, weddings and receptions.

FORD HOUSE

The Ford House was named for Jerome Ford who was sent north in 1852 by his employer, sawmill owner Henry Meiggs, to claim the rights to a fortune in Chinese merchandise that sunk in the schooner Frolic off the

Mendocino Coast near Caspar. Native Americans claimed the great gifts from the sea first, but Ford did discover vast stands of timber which could be used in the building of San Francisco.

The California State Department of Parks and Recreation acquired the Ford House as part of the Mendocino Headland State Park in 1972. They renovated the historic home, opened it as a museum and visitors center in 1983 and turned it over to the non-profit Mendocino Area Parks Association (MAPA) in 1986. Today docents and volunteer programs enable the Ford House to be open on a regular basis. An interesting staff will entertain your visit, answer all manner of questions and perhaps send you on your way with an interesting selection of cards, books, gifts and memories. Interpretive walks are led by MAPA docents out of the Ford House. The descendants of hearty pioneer gardens, including wild cabbage, roses, nasturtium and Himalayan blackberrys line the cliffs and trails.

So, after you have found a place to eat, sleep and be cozy - the inner journey begins. Icons is a gift shop from which to center and







KELLEY HOUSE

Kelley House was built by William H. Kelly in 1861. William was a ship carpenter, logger, store keeper and entrepreneur who eventually purchased almost the entire Mendocino peninsula (for \$2,650). He married Eliza Lee Owen in 1855 at his birthplace, Prince Edward Island, Canada, and they returned to Mendocino to live the rest of their lives. The Kelley House was deeded to the Mendocino Historical Research (M.H.R.) in 1975 and restoration began. Today guests can explore an archives of outstanding 1800's photographs of houses, buildings and

Mendocino pioneers. The Kelley House publishes the Mendocino Historical Review and Newsletters and there are walking tours of Mendocino for small groups, bus tours and a variety of stimulating annual events are hosted. MUSIC, ART and

For decades Mendocino has served as a magnet for artists and art-It is a mysterious process as to what makes an "art colony". It seems that once a few artists settle in an area, more are drawn to it, fired by a desire to escape bureaucracy and live in the vicinity of other free-thinkers



The big tent of the world famous Mendocino Music Festival

and creative spirits. Mendocino, with its rugged natural beauty on all sides, would seem a natural choice. The village is human-scaled, with buildings no more than two stories high, and few enough that one can comfortable stroll the town in a day.

Here is a paint box paradise, with vistas that are transformed not only by miles, but by minutes, in the constantly shifting sunlight. As weather fronts sweep off the Pacific Ocean, they may present a different palette of colors every day. The ever-restless surf and evergreen forests are like gems which show various facets as the lighting changes. On foggy days, tones become softly diffused and muted, layering the landscape like a Japanese screen. When clouds gather on the evening horizon, signaling a storm soon to come, the sunset becomes dramatic with the colors of fire and smoke. Rainy spells are long and drenching, bringing out deep, moody shades. And in the sunny weather that follows, hues are absolutely sparking in the crisp, clean air, while the seas are turned to whipped cream by the winds.

In the post-war era, Mendocino was almost a ghost town, its lumber mill dismantled when virgin redwoods were depleted from the surrounding hills. Its quaint Victorian houses, some in a state of neglect, rented cheaply then, which accounted for an initial attraction for many of the area's "pioneer" artists. Over time, galleries, studios, and a growing number of collectors lined the streets. Inevitably, as the town became refurbished and more desirable, rents rose accordingly. Today, most of the area's artists have spread out into neighboring small towns and down isolated rural roads. Most of these home studios are not open to the public - the artisans use the many exhibit spaces in Mendocino Village to show their creative products.

Mendocino County also boasts a fair number of published writers and poets, and has several small but professional performing arts groups. A full range of musical talents - classic, folk and rock perform regularly or meet "just for fun". In fact, a government survey conducted in the 1980's deduced that this spot has one of the highest per-capita rates in the nation of residents involved in the visual and/or performing arts.

These devotees of the muses often lead double lives, juggling their artistic aspirations with economic realities. It seems that almost everyone has two jobs. The breakfast cook who flips eggs in the morning may be performing light opera that evening. The waitress could be bringing home the paycheck while her husband writes his novel. The salesgirl in the gift shop may spend her days off making jewelry. The hotel maid is really a ballerina. The carpenter holds a PhD in Physics but would rather make handcrafted furniture. . . Limited job opportunities may simply be one of the many sacrifices a person makes to live in an area of such natural splendor among other folks who share similar ideals. Indeed, perhaps it is this very mix of the mundane with the mystic that gives Mendocino that special air about it, which draws the visitor to it again and again.

MENDOCINO ART CENTER



The Mendocino Art Center is an educational and resource center for the visual and performing arts located in the quiet coastal village of Mendocino 150 miles north of San Francisco. Today the Art Center, first established by Bill and Jennie Zacha in 1959, is a retreat away from the stress and clamor of the workaday world, where the soul can breathe, the imagination take wing, and creativity realize itself - as new found acquaintances turn into friendships. This

The Mendocino Art Center has gained a national and international reputation which attracts an impressive selection of renowned faculty members, yet has remained small enough for the so very productive dialogues between teachers and students, professional artists and beginners. The faculty, students and indeed the whole town is proud of the wide variety of classes, workshops, slide/lectures, exhibitions, theater productions, festivals, fairs and entertainments.

The Textile and Fiber Arts program presents a wide variety of hands-on classes for all skill

Theater Productions are presented in the Art Center's Helen Schoeni Theater by the Mendocino Theatre Company, which includes a full season of plays, a dramatic readings program, and acting classes. Galleries include the Art Center's

Nichols Gallery and the Showcase Gallery on Main Street in Mendocino, as well as the Winona Gallery, which is reserved for private rental. The Art Library contains an extensive and ongoing collection of art books which are available to students, teachers, and Associate Members of the Center. Retail Shops in the Art Center and Showcase Gallery feature local and regional paintings, handmade textiles, ceramics, and other fine arts and crafts. The Mendocino Arts Magazine is a popular quarterly publication containing articles on art, artists, and the art world, entertainment features, and a complete monthly calendar. Schedules are also published for spring, summer and fall classes.

Housing at the Art Center during the summer session is modest and yet cozy, convenient and reasonably priced. Apartments feature fully equipped kitchens and private baths. Artists in residence can also rent a variety of affordable to expensive studios, cottages, apartments, rooms, and homes by the night, weekend or week within walking distance to 10 miles driving distance. POINT CABRILLO LIGHT STATION

Only God knows how many lovers, laying in bed late at night in Mendocino, have looked out their windows into the darkness and stars and been inspired by the flickering beacon of the Point Cabrillo Light Station to the north. Savior of lives, angelic light at dangers ledge, lighthouses around the world have been restored and preserved by well organized groups. This light and fog horn station was originally built in 1909 and restored in 2001 by the Point Cabrillo Lightkeepers Association in



coordination with the State Department of Parks and Recreation. The lighthouse, gift shop, gallery with historic displays, aquarium and nature exhibits are open seasonally - 11am - 4pm during the peak tourist season, spring and fall friday - monday and winters on weekends. Soooo . . . don't be disappointed by the 1/2 mile walk through Point Cabrillo Park from the parking lot into potential fog or rain - call to be sure of the hours or check the website. Paths to secret little coves of mirror calm and clear water to stormy seas will reveal mysterious splashes of life in fur and fin in grottos and along rocky crags. Be smart - be safe!

March - September guests with binoculars have a ringside seat of ospreys carrying ocean fish in their talons to nests of one to two chicks. Sometimes enormous fish break free and fall and the osprey must dive to retrieve the fish flipping around on the forest floor.

Nearby is the world famous Botanical Gardens and across the street is the south entrance to the Noyo Harbor fishing fleet, Thanksgiving Coffee and the Boatyard Shopping Center with Harvest Market, health facilities and restaurants.

HARVEST MARKET


