



The alphabetized index beginning on Page 74 lists destinations by page number. Individual destinations follow the highways in geological order, from south to north and/or east to west. Happy Trails!

PRICES and HOURS of OPERATION

All listings in the various sections of this book were cross-checked for accuracy. Prices mentioned in the features are subject to change due to fluctuations in the economy and management. Operating hours are also subject to change, especially on a seasonal basis in rural areas. As a rule of thumb, room rates usually increase \$5 - \$10 per room per year. However because of the high demand for coastal lodging, a feeding frenzy has occurred with excessive (just plain greedy) prices to make up for lost time and money. Rates have sky rocketed and the workers who support these establishments have suffered. People do not forget and corrections in real money and karma are inevitable. 
A WORD ABOUT THE REVIEWS





The population is 800 plus and Mendocino is on the National Register of Historic Places. It can be reached from the southeast by State Highway 128, from the northeast by State Highway 20, the north/south by state Highway One or by traveling the remote and picturesque Comptche-Ukiah Road. Rarely does the temperature go over 89 degrees, however days can be windy and winter storms fierce and exciting.

The cleanest air and clearest light blesses visitors and the artist community who create here. Visitors escape the summer heat and stay in a multitude of hotels, bed n breakfast inns, state park campgrounds and vacation rental homes. Demand from refugees is high, so realestate is pricey and tight. Lots of places to park your adventure van or RV along the cliffs or in the forests. Keep your vehicle and loved ones (2 n 4 legged) secure during the day and locked at night.

Fancy to traditional restaurants satisfy appetites from raw-vegan to steaks and seafood. Picnics to go, pizza, smoothies, cheese burgers, chili rellenos, smoked salmon, clam chowder, salsa & chips, organic garden fresh salads, cinnamon rolls, mochas and lattes; we have it all. 
MENDOCINO: Historic Victorian Village Map

THE WORLD FAMOUS GLASS BEACH

At the end of Elm Street in Fort Bragg is the world famous Glass Beach. There is no admission and folks travel here from all over the world looking for treasure. For years it was a dump or "trash beach". First horse and buggy; then residents would back their pick-up trucks to the edge of the cliff and unload their trash. Fire would burn away anything that wasn't enduring. The ocean would flush, rush and crush the contents: each tide and storm would reduce the rubble. What remains today are little pieces of broken




glass of various colors and sizes; some very rare and valuable. This is Glass Beach. The Sea Glass Museum, in the historic Union Lumber Company Store, is a great place to explore the history of Glass Beach and purchase a souvenir of rare treasure collected by sea glass and Glass Beach expert Captain Cass Forrington. His museum is a must see in Fort Bragg.

The symbology of Glass Beach is expressed by local minister Greg Esher of Grace Church, a place of worship and "hubs and routes" emergency shelter for the less fortunate. Greg states "God can take the trash of your life and His refining turbulent love can wash the filth away, deposit it in the deepest part of the ocean never to be seen again. He can carry away the pain as far as the "east is from the west" and your life will be changed from trash to treasure, your mess into a message, your test into testimony, your stumbling block into a stepping stone, and your brokenness into blessings."

Glass Beach Jewelry's Sea Glass Museum is

a "Must See" for all ages! Showcasing the beautiful treasure of a local former sea captain who scours Fort Bragg's plentiful Glass Beaches for rare gems. The gallery also offers fine handcrafted sea glass jewelry and art. Listed on Trip Advisor as the most popular privately owned attraction on the coast.

The full bar serves three dozen tequilas, house margaritas, brandy, gin, rum, rye, Scotch, whiskey, vodka and cocktails - my God it is an alcoholic's par-

adise. The chunky house made red and green salsa and chips make you want more and more. The menu consists of tacos, tostadas, tamales, burritos, chimichangas, enchiladas with various combinations of chicken, cachaca (shredded beef), red chili, green chili, bean, guacamole, veggies, shredded lettuce and cheese (from \$8.95 - \$12.95). Servings are generous and combination plates are from \$10.95. Beverages include coffee, milk or soft drinks (free refills) and desserts include Purple Rose cake, flan or sapodillas.

The chef uses only local catches of fish, small farm and garden organic produce and cuts of beef and chicken. The Safety Net of CHURCHES From Extraction, to Addiction, to Attraction

The Mendocino coast is ground zero for what became the world's fifth largest economy when a '49er named Jerome Ford came up to scavenge a shipwrecked Chinese schooner, the Frolic. He looked ashore and saw the real treasure and built the first lumber mill at Casper Creek. The Redwood Highway, coupled with a world-class port created the extraction economy. 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
